avajeevan Bethany Integrated Research and Development Society (Navajeevan BIRDS) is the social service wing of Bethany Navajeevan Province of the Order of the imitation of Christ, which was founded by Rev. Fr. P.T. Geevarghese Panickeruveetil, later Archbishop Geevarghese Mar Ivanios Panickaruveetil OIC in the Jacobite Church on August 15, 1919 at Mundanmala, Ranni, Perunad in Kerala.

Fr. P.T. Geevarghese had a noble vision of doing good to all people irrespective of caste, creed and religion. He wanted to start charitable institutions (Dharma Sthapanangal) for poor and the destitute people. The schools started for the ignored ones in the society is a best example of his social commitment. Bethany and its founder gave great priority to social apostolate from the very inception of the establishment of Ashram at Mundanmala and thus Bethany Ashram became a place of consolation for scores of people soon after its foundation. In 1925 Fr. P.T. Geevarghese was ordained a Bishop with the name Mar Ivanios OIC. The orphanage at Mundanmala and the visits of Bethany Fathers to help the poor in the neighbourhood has attracted many people to follow the simple bethanian lifestyle. In 1930, Mar Ivanios and his followers left Mundanmala. Bethany and its mission continued with the blessings of the founder. Bethany Ashram became the cradle of the historic re-union movement.

Along with the reunion movement Bethanians began to undertake a wide range of apostolic activities with an "All India Missionary Vision". In 1966 the congregation was raised to pontifical status. On 24th April 2000 two provinces namely Bethany Navajeeven Province and Bethany Navajyothi Province were erected in the Bethany Congregation. At present the Bethany Congregation is having 216 members and 73 students. There are 56 Bethany Ashrams and 70 different apostolates and educational institutions.

NAVAJEEVAN BETHANY SOCIAL SERVICE was founded in the year 2000 with the erection of the Bethany Navajeevan Province of the Order of the imitation of Christ. NAVAJEEVAN BETHANY SOCIAL SERVICE is rechristened as NAVAJEEVAN BIRDS on 2018 and driven with the spirit and dynamism of 100 years of history that narrates the beginning of Bethany from August 15, 1919 at Mundanmala. It has ever

been inspired with the faith and social teachings of Catholic Church. It has an extensive reach to the poor and marginalized communities and has initiated many grass-root development interventions during its 18 years of existence.

NAVAJEEVAN BIRDS INTERVENTIONS IN SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT; A BRIEF OUTLINE

1. Bethany Social Apostolate in Kanjiramkulam - 1961

Kanjiramkulam Bethany mission has seen many creative social interventions by the Bethany fathers even before its starting in the year 1961 June 17. But the mission became a solace for many who got affected with snake bites after the foundation of Ashram. Bethany also provided ayurvedic and herbal medicines for the sick people of the locality.

2. Bethany Social Apostolate in Nedumangadu - 1968

Nedumangadu Mission was taken up by Bethany fathers in the year 1968 in order to strengthen and unify its mission activities. Bethany Ashram over the years has contributed with human resource and financial resource for the upliftment of the different communities. Bethany took great initiatives in the social development of this mission area. Bethany Press, Bethany Tailoring Center, Bethany ITC, Bethany College are the major initiatives in Nedumangad.

3. Trppaadam Bethany Old Age Home, Nedumangadu- 1974

Trppaadam Bethany Old Age Home is a social welfare centre initiated by Rev. Fr. Gabriel Thaikadavil OIC. This centre is engaged in programmes for the spiritual uplift of the people, and in rural development programmes. The center have been running development programmes like cottage industries, Basket wearing, Agarbatti, Bracelet, Candle making, Pickle making, stitching etc. Today the centre accommodates more than 60 senior citizens among them many are differently abled. The inmates are involved in Card making, Agriculture and other household activites

4. Bethany Nature Cure Center, Nalanchira – 1976

Bethany Nature Cure centre was established in the year 1976, the first of tis kind in Kerala, in a building which was located at Bethany Ashram, Nalanchira. On August 1982, a new hospital building was inaugurated at Mekkonam, Bethany Nagar, Na-

lanchira. Bethany Nature cure centre is one of the best naturopathy hospitals in India. Besides hospital facility it also credits for various research programmes in the field of Naturopathy. Dr. Fr. Philip Neri OIC (ND) has been in charge of this centre. Besides hospital facility, it also credits for various research programmes in the field of Naturopathy. Bethany provides scientific system of healing by stimulating the body's inherent power to regain health with the help of 'panchaboothas'- air, earth, water, fire and ether. It treats physical, mental and spiritual aspects of human being through a holistic approach towards diseases.

5. TB Rehabilitation Center, Pulayanarkotta- 1980

TB Rehabilitation center at Pulayanarkotta runs purely on charitable basis and rehabilitates TB patients after or during their treatment in the Government run TB hospital at Pulayanarkotta. The center was started in the year 1980. Fr. John Kuzhinapurath OIC worked as the chaplain of TB Sanatorium at Pulayanarkotta. He cycled several kilometers every day to do missionary and charitable work. When he realised that the families of the patients discharged after treatment have not been receiving them, he felt sympathy towards them and founded this home to rehabilitate them. He started the prayer centre at the T. B. Sanitorium at Pulayanarkotta, Trivandrum. Now the center houses around 15 people who are in need post TB care.

6. Bethany Social Apostolate in Tamilnadu; St. Antony's Home, Vencode - 2004

St. Antony's home was founded in 2004 along with other educational institutions in the campus and to cater to the needs of socially deprived children especially orphans and semi orphans. Now there are around 15 students staying in this center.

7. Grace Cancer Care, Nalanchira- 2008

GRACE (Archbishop Mar Gregorios Cancer Endowment) is a Charitable Endowment for helping the poor cancer patients. It provides financial assistance for medical treatment and the rehabilitation of the patients and their families irrespective of religion, caste, creed, age or sex. It also intends to organize cancer awareness camps, counselling and advisory assistance for the treatment and also to establish palliative care

centres. The endowment is initiated by Fr. Atmanand OIC, a member of the Bethany Ashram, who has been a cancer patient for 18 years.

8. Grace Pain and Palliative Care Unit, Bethany Ashram, Trppadam

The World Health Organization defines palliative care as "the active total care of patients whose disease is not responsive to curative treatment. Control of pain, of other symptoms, and of psychological, social and spiritual problems, is paramount. The goal of palliative care is achievement of the best quality of life for patients and their families". Taking into account the deprived situation of the many terminally ill people in Nedumangad civil Taluk and around, the auspicious banner of GRACE (Archbishop Mar Gregorios Cancer Endowment), Nalanchira, Bethany Navajeevan province launched a palliative care unit in Bethany Ashram, Shantigiri, Kulapada later shifted to Trppadam.

9. Bethany Skill Development Center, Kolkata - 2015

Kolkata being inspirational in the life of Mar Ivanios, when he was a professor at Serampore College, in the shaping of a religious congregation, Bethany Ashram took special initiative to start an Ashram Kolkata. Ever since its beginning it takes care of the social as well as pastoral needs of the community and socio development activities for the local people. 1993 Bethany Ashram Kolkata started a Homepathic free Dispensary for the poor people in the locality. In 2015 a skill development institute for tailoring also started. At present around 40 students learn the tailoring skill.

10. Bethany Navajeevan Home for elderly care, Kattanam- 2015

Bethany Navajeevan home for Senior Citizens was started in the year 2015 for giving geriatric care and facilities for assisted living in a warm ambience with minimal charges.

11. Bethany Educational support through foundations

NAVAJEEVAN BIRDS, with the help of many charitable foundations educate number

of underprivileged children especially in the region of Nedumangadu, Trivandrum. Many students in different fields completed their education and maintain quality life with the help of these foundations.

12. Bethany Educational aid through institutions

Bethany Navajeevan province is clear in its principle of not taking any donation for any admission or teaching vacancy in any institutions. More than that it helps lots of poor students from difficult financial background to get their education finished. Through social service wing, educational institutions give fee concession in lakhs.

13. Bethany Housing Projects

Bethany is helping many homeless families to have a shelter. Through NAVAJEEVAN BIRDS Bethany has reached out to many families in providing a shelter over the years.

14. Bethany Flood Relief Project - A Report

The flood relief and rehabilitation work at Kerala by the Bethany Navajeevan Province, Trivandrum, which is actualised by its social wing is very humble in its approach. The extent of the disaster and the suffering of the poor people brought tears to the eyes of the participating priests and brothers while performing the noble task of rendering relief. During and after the relief, our brothers shared with us various experiences and incidents which throw light on the multifarious aspects of such a vast service activity. This report is a descriptive account of the relief work still going on, along with suitable photographs, to give our donors, devotees and well-wishers a 'behind-the-scene' account of what it means to participate in a relief project of Navajeevan BIRDS!

Spontaneous Response to Alleviate Sufferings and Lives Touched:

Evaluation of Immediate Need and Immediate Response

The flood relief committee assessed the immediate need of the affected population in view of the available information through different sources responded immediately to the needs:

Provision of boat service to rescue the victims:

We could arrange boat service for rescue operation from Poovar Boat Club, Trivandrum. The rescue operation was done in association with Chetana, the social service wing Malankara Catholic Diocese of Mavelikara.

Fund Raising

For any kind of contribution to the affected population, money is required. It was proposed in the meeting that an immediate fund raising campaign should be initiated on the campus as well as outside the campus. Cherupushpa School, Bethany Navajeevan Vidyalaya, Nalanchira and Mount Bethany School, Mylapra were taken as fund collection points.

Provision of consumables and other needful items

We could provide drinking water, clothes, sanitary Items, Health and hygiene items to around three thousand eight hundred and fifty people in 14 camps, households and affected areas.
