
KERALA FLOODS – 2018

INTERVENTIONS BY BETHANY NAVAJEEVAN SOCIAL SERVICE (BNSS) REPORT AND FUTURE ACTION PLAN



Spontaneous Response to Alleviate Sufferings and Lives Touched:

- Around 4000 People
- In 7 days
- 3 Districts

Multiphase flood Relief Effort:

• First Phase: - Immediate Relief- Food Distribution

• Second Phase: - Relief Kits, Cleaning

• Third Phase:- Rehabilitation – Adopting Family, Students, Parish

1. BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

- In late July 2018, severe flooding affected Kerala state in India
- Kerala received heavy monsoon rainfall on the mid-evening of August 8 resulting in dams filling to capacity; in the first 24 hours of rainfall the state received 310 mm (12 in) of rain.
- Almost all dams have been opened since the water level has risen close to overflow level due to heavy rainfall, flooding local low-lying areas.
- For the first time in the state's history, 35 of its 42 dams have been opened
- Over 373 people died within a fortnight
- At least 280,679 people were evacuated
- Over 5,645 relief camps have been opened at various locations to accommodate the flood victims.
- People from Chengannur, Pandanad, Aranmula, Aluva, Chalakudy, Kuttanad,
 Pandalam are still in relief camps
- It is estimated that 1,247,496 people have found shelter in such camps.
- The Kerala State Disaster Management Authority has placed the state in a red alert as a result of the intense flooding.
- 14 districts of the state placed on high alert
- A number of water treatment plants were forced to cease pumping water, resulting in poor access to clean water, especially in northern districts of the region.
- The flooding has affected hundreds of villages, destroyed an estimated 10,000 km (6,200 mi) of roads and thousands of homes have been damaged or destroyed.

2. BNSS AND FLOOD RELIEF

3. BNSS MISSION

The mission of BNSS is to alleviate human suffering caused by flood that may impact people locally.

4. BNSS OBJECTIVES

- To get engaged in a series of dialogue and visits with the affected communities of Chengannor, Pallipadu
- To support rehabilitation, livelihood and enhance occupation development related to their resources and choices in community

- To support the vulnerable population like mothers who are the primary care providers for their children have lost their jobs, their land, and their property
- To support the Diocesan Social Service agencies in providing relief work

5. BNSS INTERVENTIONS ALREADY EXECUTED

BNSS responded to the disastrous floods in a very active and timely manner. The following activities were executed:

5.1. Launching of Flood Relief Campaign

5.1.1. Provincial Council Meeting

An emergency meeting was held at Bethany Provincial House, Nalanchira presided by V. Rev. Fr. Mathew Jacob Thiruvalil OIC, attended by Fr. Thomas George OIC, Fr. Mathew Manaluvila OIC, Fr. Jacob Dayanand OIC and Fr. Geevarghese Thiruvalil OIC to discuss and look into the possibilities of BNSS response to the flood affected areas of Chenganoor, Pandanad and Pathanamthitta. Frs. Mathew Manaluvila OIC the social service co-ordinator and Fr. Jacob Dayanand OIC the Province Procurator were given the charge of flood relief coordination. In the meeting it was decided to work on few aspects.

5.1.2. Flood Relief Committee

A flood relief committee was constituted immediately to look after the need assessment, fund raising, and distribution on daily basis. The committee was coordinated by Fr. Mathew Manaluvila OIC and Fr. Jacob Dayanand OIC. The other members are;

5.2. Evaluation of Immediate Need and Immediate Response

The flood relief committee assessed the immediate need of the affected population in view of the available information through different sources responded immediately to the needs:

5.2.1. Provision of boat service to rescue the victims:

We could arrange boat service for rescue operation from Poovar Boat Club, Trivandrum and thereby we could save around 560 people. The rescue operation was done in association with Chetana, the social service wing Malankara Catholic Diocese of Mavelikara.

5.2.2. Fund Raising

For any kind of contribution to the affected population, money is required. It was proposed in the meeting that an immediate fund raising campaign should be initiated on the campus as well as outside the campus. Cherupushpa School, Bethany Navajeevan Vidyalaya, Nalanchira and Mount Bethany School, Mylapra were taken as fund collection points.

5.2.3. Provision of consumables and other needful items

We could provide drinking water, clothes, sanitary Items, Health and hygiene items to around three thousand eight hundred and fifty people in 14 camps, households and affected areas.

5.2.4. Collection of relief goods

Collection of relief goods took place through different schools of Bethany Navajeevan Province. There were ten local collection points and two regional collection points:

6. FUTURE INTERVENTION PLANS

BNSS plans to continue its relief activities through short, medium and long term rehabilitation interventions. These interventions will be focused on:

- Adopting Students
- Adopting a Family
- Adopting a Parish

BNSS plans to work in the following four areas

a. Adopting Students

Over 1000 students who have directly been affected by the floods in the areas of Chenganoor, Pandanad and Pathanamthitta. Due to their great financial loss, it will be difficult for them to continue with their education, without assistance. For the continuation of these students' education, donors can sponsor students for one year. The students' fees and other expenses like school bags, Notebooks, etc will be 30000 thousand per year.

BNSS would like to take 25 students for a year spending 30000/-

Total Cost for 25 students = 25x30000 = 750000/-

b. Adopting a Family

Donors can choose to adopt a family living in the flood affected area that has great financial loss. This will include giving a monthly amount of 20,000 INR for household consumables.

BNSS would like to support 35 families by providing 20000 thousand each

Total Cost for 35 families – 35 families x 20000= 700000/-

Donors can also contribute to:

Constructing houses -10 Houses -10 houses $\times 500000 = 5000000/-$

Repairing houses –25 Houses – 25 Houses x 100000= 2500000/-

Constructing Toilets – 25 Toilets - 25 Toilets x 50000= 1250000/-

c. Adopting a Parish

Donors may choose to invest in water supply and sanitation facilities of the selected area by providing safe water, improved sanitation facilities. This will include low cost drinking water treatment plants and culturally acceptable sustainable toilets and sanitation systems.

Donors can also invest for conducting Health Camps and providing health and hygiene materials.

Total cost for sanitation and Health camps – 500000/-

d. **Miscellaneous donations:** Donors may also donate any amount of money, if they do not wish to choose any of the above mentioned options. These donations will be used to contribute towards any of the above mentioned focus areas.

7. TOTAL PROJECT COSTS

Total Cost for 25 students = 25x30000 = 750000/
Total Cost for 35 families - 35 families x 20000 = 700000/
Constructing houses -10 Houses - 10 houses x 500000 = 5000000/
Repairing houses -25 Houses - 25 Houses x 100000 = 2500000/
Constructing Toilets - 25 Toilets - 25 Toilets x 50000 = 1250000/
Total cost for sanitation and Health camps = 500000/-
